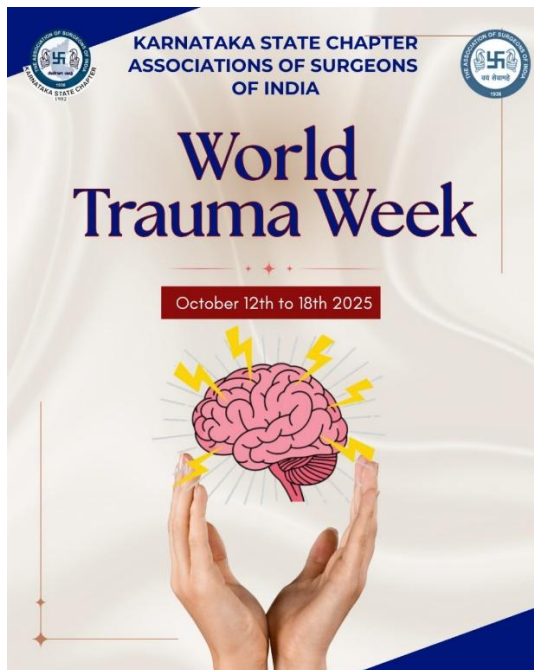



Attended by: 400 students of SJMVS Arts and Commerce College, Hubballi.

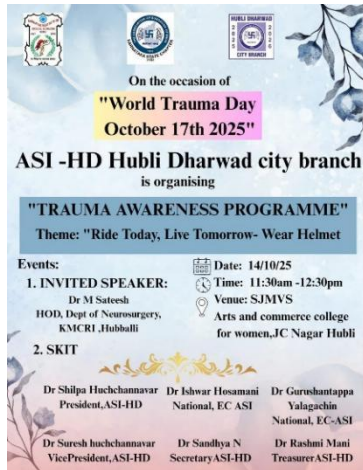
The theme was “Ride Today, Live Tomorrow, Wear Helmet.”

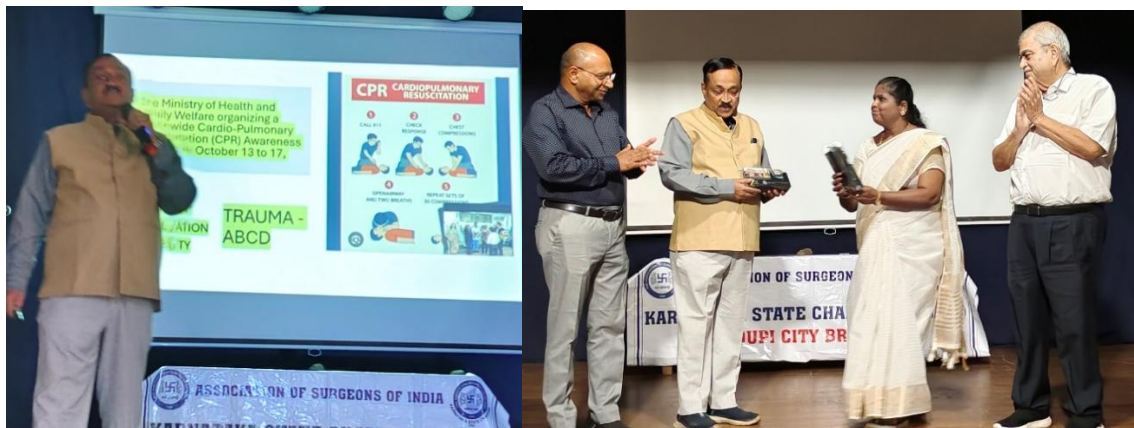

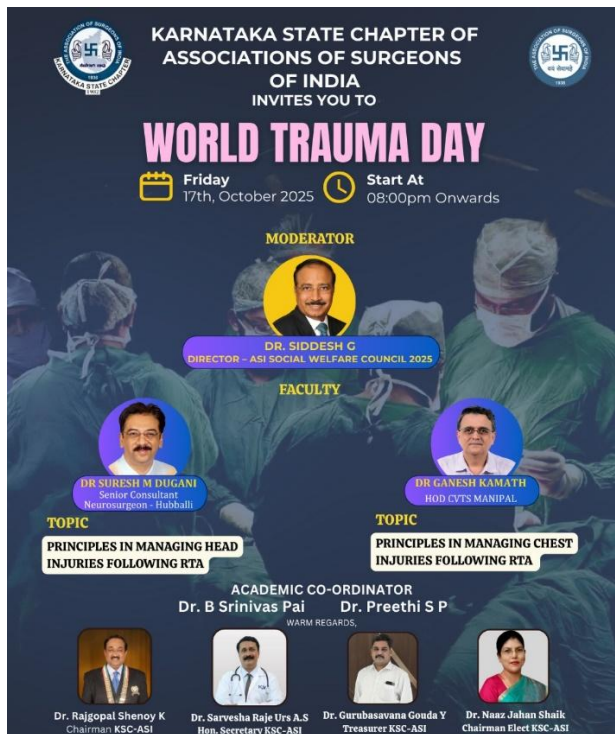

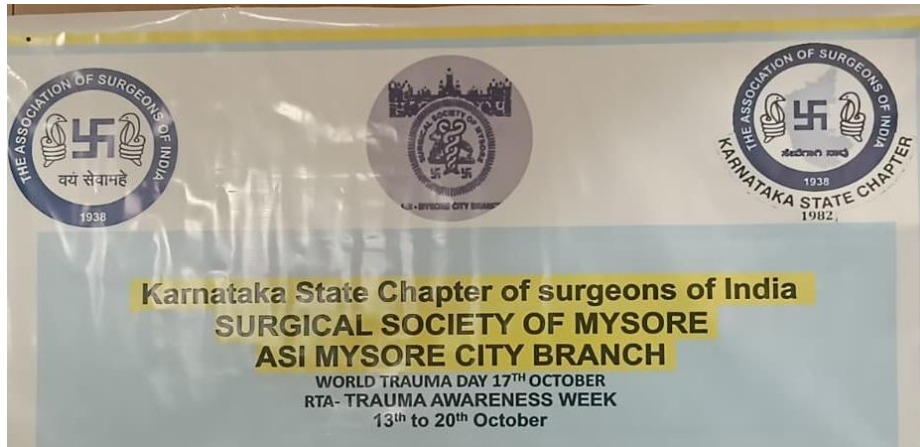

## KSC-ASI TRAUMA AWARENESS ARTICLE ON RTA GUIDELINES

## 1. ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS – GUIDELINES FOR SAFETY WHILE DRIVING.

Article . In fact it has been used extensively by various city branches to spread RTA awareness.

The data submitted by Union Minister for Highways to the Rajya Sabha shows that 67,933 accidents took place on national highways up to June 2025. As many as 29,018 people died in road accidents on National Highways in the first six months of 2025 calendar year. In 2024, 53,090 people died in 1,25,873 accidents across national highways.

The major cause for the accidents was speeding, contributing to 71.2% of road crash deaths. Two-wheeler users who constituted to 44.5% of fatalities, and pedestrians accounted for nearly 20% of deaths. Over half of the fatalities occurred on national and state highways, despite their small percentage of the overall road network. Human error is the reason behind most accidents.

### **Road safety guidelines**

To avoid road traffic accidents, drivers must strictly follow the traffic rules, maintain a safe speed, avoid distractions like mobile phones, and never drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Practicing defensive driving (driving with caution while avoiding rashness), wearing seatbelts and helmets, ensuring regular vehicle maintenance also significantly reduce the risk. Staying alert on roads, taking breaks during long drives to avoid fatigue, respecting other road

users, and driving according to road conditions are key to a safer journey.

#### A. Driver Behaviours

- Obey Traffic Laws:

Adhere to speed limits, traffic signals, and road signs. Don't drive without valid driving license. Dump vehicles which are unfit for driving.

- Stay Vigilant, Avoid Distraction:

Stay attentive, keep away mobile phones, avoid eating/ alcohol consumption, or adjusting the radio. Don't fight with fellow passengers while driving.

- Never Drive Under the Influence:

Do not drive under the influence of alcohol/ drugs, as they impair judgment and reaction times.

- Practice Defensive Driving:

Anticipate dangerous situations/ hazards, check mirrors while changing lanes or before slowing down/ stopping, maintain a safe distance between vehicles according to your speed, and be anticipate other road users' mistakes. Slowdown in village zones, and at pedestrian/ animal crossings.

- Wear Safety Equipment:

Always wear a seatbelt when driving and a helmet when riding a motorcycle or bicycle. Even buses must provide seat belts to passengers.

- Don't Drive Fatigued:

If you are tired, pull over and take a break or switch drivers. Avoid night driving, as far as possible.

- Mode of travel:

For long distances on highways, preferably use public transport. Chose cabs from reputed travel agencies and check your driver's skill and experience. Advise him to adhere to traffic rules, not to over speed or consume alcohol before driving.

## B. Vehicle and Road Practices

- **Maintain Your Vehicle:**

Get regular vehicle maintenance on essential components like brakes and lights, tyre air pressure, to keep them in proper working condition. Avoid dark sun films that reduce visibility, particularly in dim light. Check wind shield condition before start of journey.

- **Check Road Conditions:**

Be aware of poor road conditions, bad weather, and adjust your driving accordingly.

- **Use Turn Signals:**

Always use your turn signals while changing lanes, taking turns, or slowing down/ stopping to communicate your intentions to other drivers and pedestrians.

- **Be Patient:**

Avoid rash driving, weaving through traffic or road rage. Stay calm and focused. Don't intimidate or fight with other road users.

- **Leave Early:**

Give yourself extra time for your journey to avoid being rushed and to allow for unexpected delays. Don't set time target for particular distances.

- **Car selection:**

Buy cars with latest technology, good lights and braking, electronic stability, and at least 6 airbags.

- **Two wheelers:**

Must stick to slow lanes and ride as per speed limits, assert caution while overtaking heavy vehicles, not to drive on wrong side, avoid night rides, and avoid highways as far as possible.

- **Speed bikes:**

Our highways are meant to commute at permissible speeds and not for racing. Bikers must adhere to traffic rules and speed limits.

- **Heavy vehicles:**

Must stick to slow lanes, avoid sudden lane shifts and overtaking. Regular vehicle maintenance is a must.



- Cyclists:

Must ride on highways in groups with a patrol vehicle behind them to warn other road users.

- Lane discipline:

Heavy vehicles and two-wheelers moving on fast lanes interfere with traffic movements and can result in many accidents.

- Overtaking:

Avoid cutting other drivers. Always overtake from the right side and assert extreme caution while overtaking heavy vehicles. Do not overtake from the left, or at junctions or turnings or curves. Do not overtake inside the same lane.

- City roads:

Extreme patience is mandatory. Follow lane discipline and maintain low speeds. Avoid signal jumps and assert extreme caution while taking turns (indicate to other road users). Stop, halt and proceed at junctions. Don't overtake at junctions. Don't squeeze from wrong directions at junctions. Don't honk in presence of traffic jams.

- Negotiating curves:

Negotiate curves and hilly roads at lower speeds using the slow lanes.

- Express Highways:

Express Highways are meant for safety more than speed. Due to higher vehicle density and erratic road users, safety comes first. Don't stop your vehicles on carriage ways in case of any issues. Park the vehicle in a safe zone and indicate other road users. Call local toll plaza for immediate assistance.

- Level Crossings:

Exert patience and don't squeeze through level crossings

- Flyovers:

Avoid higher speeds/ overtaking/ erratic driving on flyovers

- Pedestrians:

Pedestrians must not walk or run across roads, particularly highways. Don't trespass on to express highways. Cross the roads with caution only at specified areas

- Play a good Samaritan:

Help fellow road users in case of any accident. Pull the victim to safety and shift to nearest trauma centre. Many lives can be saved in the golden hour if the victims get immediate attention. Always carry a first aid kit in your vehicle.

Adopt humanitarian approach even if it was a mistake from the other vehicle driver.
